1. ANNOUNCEMENT: Viperformance P/L (Metrakit Australia P/L) is hereafter called THE PROMOTER of the 2009 AMCN "Festival of Champions" Solo Road Racing event. This event will be conducted by the Preston Motorcycle Club at the State Motorcycle Complex Road Circuit on Saturday the 7th of November 2009 & 7th & 8th for Junior non FOC and Junior Enduro. All racing will be in a clockwise direction using the **FULL CIRCUIT**.

2. JURISDICTION:

- 2.1. The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling Victoria who have issued an MV Permit **TBA**. This event is a **NATIONAL OPEN COMPETITION**, holders of a **current Motorcycling Australia JUNIOR or SENIOR NATIONAL LICENCE** are eligible to compete. 15 year old competitors with a suitably endorsed Junior RR National Licence are also eligible to compete in the 125 Grand Prix class. Junior competitors must provide their Log Books & licence on the day.
- 2.2. The meeting is to be held in accordance with the 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport (GCR's) as issued by Motorcycling Australia, these and attached Supplementary Regulations, the By-Laws of MV and any Final Instructions including Metrakit Machinery & Series guidelines.
- 2.3. By entering this meeting, all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.
- 2.4. Authority to use the course has been granted by MV and the State Motorcycle Complex.

3. ENTRIES:

- 3.1. Entries open forthwith and close on:
MONDAY 19TH OCTOBER 2009

NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED IN ANY CIRCUMSTANCES

- 3.2. In the event of abandonment or postponement of the Meeting, the Promoter may retain all or any part of the entry fee, if such retention is approved by MV.
- 3.3. Only entries received on the attached OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM and accompanied by the correct entry fee will be accepted.
- 3.4. The return of entry fees for any rider withdrawing from the meeting is at the discretion of the Promoter.
- 3.5. The Promoter reserves the right to refuse and return any entry subject to the relevant 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport rule.

4. INSURANCE:

- 4.1. National Personal Accident Insurance Scheme provides for basic cover with regard to death and permanent disability. Refer to the 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport for details.
- 4.2. Ambulance insurance is compulsory for all competitors.
- 4.3. It is strongly recommended that competitors give due consideration to taking out Personal Accident Insurance or Weekly Benefits Insurance.

5. ENTRY FEES:

- 5.1. Entry fees are **\$ 300.00** for each class entered . This fee excludes the electronic timing transmitter hire. A refundable deposit of \$50 will be required for each transponder.
- 5.2. Payment by **Cheque, Visa, Mastercard, or cash only by the 19TH October 2009. Credit Card transactions will incur a 3% fee.**
- 5.3. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY. NO PAYMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY.**
- 5.4. Any fees for dishonored cheques will be the responsibility of the competitor entering the event.
- 5.5. ALL cheques are to be made payable to **METRAKIT AUSTRALIA P/L**.

6. CLASSES OF COMPETITION:

- 6.1. All classes of competition are open to competitors from all grades. (ie A, B, C or D Grade). Juniors Must have appropriate Endorsed Junior RR Licence .
- 6.2. **The following listed classes will be considered National Championship Classes of competition:**
 - 6.2.1 **2009 Troy Corser Agencies Metrakit Junior GP Championship**
 - 6.2.2 **Only** Metrakit Machinery are eligible for entry/points/prizes and awards in the 2009 METRAKIT Junior GP Championship. Machinery must comply with GCR 15.15 as per the 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sports rules & Metrakit Machine and Series Guidelines. Metrakit Machinery must have been purchased through Viperformance P/L , METRAKIT AUST or a Viperformance authorised agent. Machine and Riders must have registered with Viperformance for the 2009 season and competed in series rounds in their State. Riders must enter on own registered machines. No more than 2 registered machines can be entered for the one rider.
 - 6.2.3 **Junior Metrakit 70cc:** Metrakit GP70SP, 70cc 2 stroke as per 2009 MA GCR's **15.15.0.1(c)** Competitors must be aged 9 to under 13 years.
Tyres: Must be OEM sizes, No Slicks Allowed, Brand of Tyre Open, Refer: Metrakit Machine & series guidelines.
 - 6.2.4 **Junior Metrakit 80cc:** Metrakit GP80XL Copa / GP80XLR 80cc 2 stroke as per 2009 MA GCR's **15.15.0.1.(D)** Competitors must be aged 13 to 16 years.
Tyres: Slicks, must be OEM sizes, Brand of Tyre Open, Refer: Metrakit Machine & Series Guidelines Compound A,B or C
Wets: Dunlop KR122 front 90/65 R17, rear 120/60 R17 or Bridgestone equivalent.
 - 6.2.5 **Personal Data logger/Personal data acquisition systems/Personal transponders not permitted.**
 - 6.2.6 **No Racing fuel permitted.** Up to 100 Octane max.**(unleaded service station pump fuel only)**
 - 6.2.7 The use of Tyre warmers is permitted.
 - 6.2.8 Steering Dampners are allowed to be fitted.
 - 6.2.9 **The following listed classes will not be considered Championship Classes:**
 - 6.2.10 **125 GP Hughie Hoare Challenge**
 - 6.2.11 125 GP/ 250 Mono, Solo Machinery: Refer supp regs for Hughie Hoare. Entry forms for this class are through Preston MCC
 - 6.2.12 **Junior (non FOC) & JUNIOR ENURO**
 - 6.2.13 Open to all brands of OEM homologated & approved Junior solo machinery complying with the 2009 MA

GCR's rules 70cc & 80cc 2 stroke and 160cc 4 stroke manual gearbox machines. Competitors must be aged 9 to under 16 years. Moriwaki MH80R OEM 79.4cc eligible. Machines must not exceed 2% tolerance. **RS frames not eligible** ..

- 6.2.14 If less than 8 entries in total are received for the **Junior (Non FOC) & JUNIOR enduro class**, the class will be cancelled.

- 6.2.16 Should there be insufficient entries in the Junior Non FOC Junior Enduro or 125 GP Hughie Hoare Challenge, the decision to run or cancel the class and re distribute any awards or prizemoney will be at the discretion of the promoter (Preston MCC) subject to MV approval.

7. PRIZEMONEY & TROPHIES:

- 7.1. Trophies and awards will be presented for overall placings for each class on Saturday after racing. Places will be determined by an accumulation of points in each class.
- 7.2. Any Prizemoney will be paid within seven working days of the event results being declared official. Appeals and drug testing will result in delays of payment.
- 7.3. Any Prizemoney is inclusive of GST and any liability for GST or other taxes will be the responsibility of the recipient. However, competitors should note that unless they provide the Promoter with either their ABN or a declaration that the sport is their recreational pastime, the Promoter is required to withhold 48.5% of prizemoney.

8. RACE FORMAT AND OFFICIAL PRACTICE:

- 8.1. There will be a minimum of **FIVE** events conducted per class. The Promoter reserves the right to alter or cancel any of the listed events should extraordinary circumstances arise, with the exception of the Metrakit

Junior GP Championship events which will take precedence. The Clerk of Course with the approval of the MA Steward may shorten or lengthen race distances if time and/or circumstances permit/require. Extra **non points** scoring races may be added if time and circumstances permit. Please refer to **FINAL INSTRUCTIONS** for the final event schedule and number of events.

- 8.2. **Official Practice will be held on the Friday 6th November at a cost of \$110.00. Please note : For all Metrakit FOC Competitors, (no racing or practice permitted 14 days prior to the 6th November), this includes private hiring of the circuit.**

9. GRID POSITIONS:

- 9.1. Grid positions for each event will be determined at Official Qualifying , and will be based on fastest times recorded. In the event of failure of the timing system, gridding will be at the discretion of Senior Officials.
- 9.2. Subsequent events for each class will utilise the grid positions determined by official qualifying. Progressive grids will not be utilised.
- 9.3. Grid pattern will be 4, 4, 4, 4.
- 9.4. Spare positions on the grid will not be filled.
- 9.5. A maximum of 40 Solos in the 125 GP Challenge and junior classes will be permitted to start.
- 9.6. If any competitor is likely to be lapped more than once in any event, they may be black flagged in the interest of safety.
- 9.7. Competitors who enter late or who do not complete an event or participate in qualifying may be placed on the rear of the grid at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

10. RIDING NUMBERS:

- 10.1. Riders will be advised of their riding number after the close of entries. Riders must quote their usual riding number in the space provided on the entry form. **Every effort will be made to allocate this number to the rider, however, the promoter reserves the right to allocate numbers.**
- 10.2. All machines shall be fitted with three number plates, one on the front of the machine and one on each side of the machines towards the rear as per the 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport rules.

11. CHANGE OF MACHINES:

- 11.1. Any rider may change his/her machines prior to the start of each race provided the following points are adhered to:
- 11.2. Change of machine will be permitted only if the request is submitted in writing to the Clerk of Course with the approval of the MA Steward and via the Race Secretary at least 20 minutes prior to the start of the event in which the change is required.
- 11.3. NO rider may change to a machine that has not been entered in the meeting. There is provision on the entry form for spare machine details to be entered.

12. MACHINE EXAMINATION:

- 12.1. Will take place from 7.30am on SATURDAY. **ALL COMPETITORS** must present his/her machine/s, leathers, helmet, back protector, gloves, boots, eye protection, licence and scrutineering card for inspection. Machine and Protective Equipment examination will be done at the same time. Lower fairing to be removed.
- 12.2. Machines found to be emitting fluid of any description WILL be excluded. Engine breathers must be fed into a vapour trap of at least the same capacity as the engine capacity. Radiators must be filled with water. **NO COOLANTS OR GLYCOL SUBSTANCES OF ANY DESCRIPTION ARE TO BE USED IN COOLING SYSTEMS.** At the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer, machines entered in the days racing events may be selected at random for capacity check or eligibility at any time. Competitors are asked to consult their 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport for maximum overbore for the events.
- 12.3. **Metrakit machinery:** At the conclusion of the Championship event, the 1st to 4th placing machines in the 70cc and 80 cc classes **will** be impounded, the cylinders, and reed cages along with any other parts on the machinery requested to be removed for inspection to OEM

specifications. An adult member of the riders team **must** be present during this process at all times and to assist in the removal of parts . Failure to comply with this rule will result in automatic exclusion from the event results.

- 12.4. Metrakit machinery found not to comply to OEM specifications and Metrakit machine and series guidelines will result in automatic exclusion and disqualification OF THE RIDER from the event results, and final placings will be adjusted accordingly. **It is the responsibility of the Rider/ parent or Guardian (ONLY) to ensure that the Metrakit Machinery is OEM & Complies to The Metrakit Machine & Series Guidelines.**
- 12.5. All Metrakit machines are required to display the special Championship or Series Sponsor stickers. These must be displayed as instructed by the Promoter. All other Championship stickers including that of any sponsor that is a direct or indirect competitor of Metrakit must be removed. The Promoter reserves the right to exclude any participant or his or her Team member/ Parent or Guardian that does not comply with the requirements or that shows an incorrect or unsporting behaviour.
- 12.6. All machines must be fitted with an effective engine kill switch.
- 12.7. Any machine involved in an accident must be represented for machine and protective equipment examination before continuing with the days events.
- 12.8. Metal valve stems or shortie rubber stems are mandatory in all tubeless tyre applications.

13. RIDERS BRIEFING:

- 13.1. SATURDAY at 8.30am. **All Riders are required to attend riders briefing.** Riders will be required to sign on at the conclusion of the briefing. Riders not present or in special circumstances not having a representative **WILL** be excluded from the days racing. This may also apply if the mandatory sign on at Riders Briefing is not completed.

14. STARTS AND RACING:

- 14.1. Competitors must be ready no later than 2 minutes after being called on to start. Starting method for all events will be clutch starts. Competitors leave pit lane/dummy grid and complete one warm up lap. On return, a red flag will be displayed at the start line. When all is ready, having due regard to safety, the flag official will leave the line, the starter will turn the lights to red for 2 to 5 seconds and then turn the red light **off** which is the signal to start. Any competitor judged to have started before the red light goes off, will be penalised according to GCR's with relegation, fine, time penalty or exclusion as determined by the starter, Clerk of Course and/or Steward. The above penalties also apply to riding in a dangerous manner / mono's / wheelies or burnouts.
- 14.2. All riders not already on the circuit when pit gate closes will be starting from pit lane under the direction of the Clerk of Course with no sighting/warm up lap.
- 14.3. Time is of a premium at this meeting therefore any rider deliberately wasting time on the sighting lap will be dealt with by the Clerk of Course.

15. DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 15.1. All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with the Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 15.2. If any doubts exist over banned substances, it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline on 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney and the distribution of awards may be delayed at the discretion of MV until the results of the tests are known.

16. CODE OF CONDUCT:

- 16.1. All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia by-law – Code of Conduct (as stipulated in the 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This **CODE OF CONDUCT** applies to this

meeting and will be **ENFORCED.**

17. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

- 17.1. State Motorcycle complex is constructed of bitumen, the full circuit has a track length of 2.16 km. The Motorcycling Australia Track License number is MA 7322.
- 17.2. All races will be run in a clockwise direction.

18. COURSE INSPECTION:

- 18.1. All competitors will have the opportunity of walking over the length of the course to be used for racing prior to practice commencing, for the purposes of familiarising themselves with the layout and condition of the course. Competitors who having walked the course, have any grievances with the condition of the course should advise the Steward or Clerk of Course immediately following their inspection.

19. NOISE:

- 19.1. All machines must comply with the General Competition Rules of Motorcycling Australia.
- 19.2. In addition, all machines must comply with a 95dB ride by limit as required by the EPA. Machines over 95dB may be excluded from any results and barred until their noise level is reduced.
- 19.3. Machines over 95dB will be black flagged immediately upon detection and must be presented to the scrutineer for inspection.
- 19.4. Subject to the scrutineers approval of noise reduction measures, the machine may be cleared to recommence racing.
- 19.5. A second infringement will result in immediate black-flagging and exclusion from the meeting.

20. POINTS:

- 20.1. FOC championship Event will be conducted over 5 legs. Point scoring of events where applicable will be as per GCR's.
- 20.2. In the event of a tie for placings over the 5 legs, the higher placed competitor in the final leg of the event will be awarded the position.

21. IMPOUNDING OF MACHINES:

- 21.1. Refer to items 12.2 and 12.3

22. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

- 22.1. Protests will be lodged as per the 2009 Manual of Motorcycle Sport rules.
- 22.2. There will be timing equipment utilised at this meeting. **All competitors must have a \$50 refundable deposit to be able to hire the required transmitter.** CASH or CHEQUE only.
- 22.3. Fuel is not available at the track for 125 or Non FOC Junior classes.
- 22.4. Body Piercing must be covered with tape or removed.
- 22.5. Alcohol is not permitted at this event. Riders/ Parents Guardians concerned will be excluded from the event.
- 22.6. **Wheeled devices of any type (excluding competitor machines & Official pit scooters) are not permitted during this event. These devices will be confiscated and may incur a \$50 fine.**
- 22.7. Children under the age of 16 years are not permitted in pit lane unless a competitor or immediate family with adult supervision.
- 22.8. No dogs other than guide dogs are permitted within the circuit grounds at any time.
- 22.9. The club recommends that all competitors have a suitable fire extinguisher.

23. GENERAL ADMISSION PASSES: ADMISSION FREE

- 23.1. N/A Donation to Hughie Hoare fund

24. PRESENTATION:

- 24.1. Festival Of Champions will take place on the Podium after racing and confirmation of winners at the conclusion of the event on Saturday . Presentation dinner on Saturday night.

25. PIT GARAGES:

- 25.1. Are **ONLY** available by booking and paying on the official

entry form.

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below):

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

DEFINITIONS

2. In this declaration:

- "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
- "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
- "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
- "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
- "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
- "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

3. I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
 - that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
 - that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
 - that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
 - that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
 - that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)

4. Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are:
- rendered with due care and skill;
 - as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and
 - reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

 - that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
 - that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;

- I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnitees (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnitees and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

PRIVACY

- I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the Promoter/Event Organiser, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by the Promoter, and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by the Promoter/Event Organiser by contacting MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

- I hereby agree with MA and the SCB that in consideration for my participation in the Event that MA and the SCB may receive, collect, store and use personal health information about me in the manner set out below:
 - I ACKNOWLEDGE that:**
 - If I am injured, become ill or die at or following the Event the party listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1 in addition to any hospital at which I am treated (together "my Carers") will have health related information about me in their possession, power and control relating to me which is subject to obligations imposed by the Privacy Act ("my Information") and the Privacy Act is intended to protect my personal information;
 - MA and my SCB wish to collect my Information for purposes that include their risk management programs, evaluating and improving the safety of MA and SCB events and of the Meeting organisers and facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport; and
